# 2018 Year in Review

2018 has been a banner year for COMMIT. Having served over 500 for the first time in our seven year history, we nearly tripled our numbers from last year.

As 2018 concludes, COMMIT reflects on our greatest year to date. Our success is made possible by the support of our donors and partners. This report details the impact your investment has on COMMIT and more importantly, on the servicemembers and veterans we serve.

## Program Highlights

- COMMIT provided personalized support to more than 350 servicemembers and veterans through our 1:1 Transition
   Assistance.
- COMMIT conducted 10 Transition
   Mentoring Workshops, compared to just
   6 last year. Not only did this allow us to
   serve 130 transitioning personnel via
   workshops, these events significantly
   amplified our brand and reputation.





## Money Raised

- COMMIT raised over \$1.7M in charitable support in 2018, including gifts from Charitable
   Foundations, Corporate Contributions, Individual Contributions, and Special Event Revenue.
- The COMMIT Foundation's 5th Annual
   Changing the Narrative Gala took place in
   Washington, D.C. for the first time. It was our


